ICT visit

Earlier this week I had a meeting with Mr May to understand more about the recently purchased Google Chromebooks and how these will be accessed by the children for learning purposes. I admit I'm fairly new to Google, being more familiar with MS Office and Apple, so it was a learning curve for me. For those not familiar with the Chromebook, it is essentially a laptop with a keyboard, so children will learn keyboard skills rather than just using a touchscreen.

I was able to see work completed in class by year 5 students for a Roman warrior 'Wanted' poster. Children had time in the class to create the poster and were able to receive real time feedback from their teacher about suggestions for improving their work e.g. changing font type to make the poster clearer to read or adding in a title. The children were excited to receive the comments and were able to react to these and update their work immediately.

Cyber security is a growing concern for parents and I raised specific questions about email and access to appropriate material. The children are only able to email within the Goldsworth domain and unable to send or receive emails externally, therefore teaching them how to use the technology in a safe environment. Access to websites is carefully restricted so that children should not be able to access inappropriate material.

It was clear to me that there is a great deal of enthusiasm both from the staff and children, certainly if my children are anything to go by, and this will be key to making good use of the Chromebooks. It is still early days and staff and children are getting to grips with new ways of doing things but already, half a term in, I'm sure the benefits are being enjoyed by our children.
