Proven power of reading - did you know?

- Reading for pleasure is more important for children's cognitive development than their parents' level of
 education and is a more powerful factor in life achievement than socio-economic background. 16-yearolds who choose to read books for pleasure outside of school are more likely to secure managerial or
 professional jobs in later life.
- Children who read books often at age 10 and more than once a week at age 16 gain higher results in maths, vocabulary and spelling tests at age 16 than those who read less regularly.
