#### Head's Lines

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back, I hope you had a fun filled half term and are ready for the exciting run up to Christmas. We had a productive start to the half term with our INSET day where the Admin support staff learnt about our new communication tool, Arbor and the class support staff learnt about more about our phonics programme, our provision mapping tool and playground games. The teachers focused on reading and writing. Whilst considering reading we discussed the importance of using high quality book/texts to build children's vocabulary and their love of reading. The benefits of reading include increased general knowledge, a positive impact on academic achievement, enhanced reading ability and vocabulary growth.

As part of our reading culture across school, we would like each child to continue experiencing the wonderful world of books at home. Reading with your child (whether you read to them or they read to you) is an essential part of being an effective learner. Research tells us that reading out loud to children and young people or them reading to you, develops them as learners and widens their vocabulary, giving them wider opportunities during their schooling and adult life.

With this in mind, we are introducing a fun way to record how much reading your child is taking part in at home. This is wonderful opportunity for the whole family to enjoy the pleasure of reading. Please see page 3 for further information.

### **Reading at home**

In some of our classes we have been trialling a new digital reading record. This is called Boom Reader, where you can record the pages you have read with your child and write a comment about their reading. If your child is reading independently then they will be able to write a comment and the pages that they have read as well. At the end of each book the children will be rewarded with gems for their reading, they can use these to collect cards on the app. At school we will be sharing with the children how to log on and record their reading and a letter will come home explaining how to access this.
