Head's Lines

Dear Parents/Carers,

We can certainly say that 'it is beginning to look a lot like Christmas' at Goldsworth. From the Santa run on Sunday to the Year 1 Carol service today, it is a lovely time to be in school. I am sure, like me that road safety is at the fore front of your mind for all our children. We are increasingly concerned that at school drop off and pick up our children are not as safe as they could be. Many families use the car park as a footpath and we have had some near misses where children are not safe. The car park is not a footpath and should not be used as such. It is vital that families, with or without their children do not walk through the car park as there are cars moving around at these times. We would also politely request that children are using their scooters on the footpath and not through the car park. Our staff and visitors leave their cars in the car park and, sadly, a scooter bumped into a staff member's car.

In addition to this we have seen some very dangerous driving around the entrance to school where, again, children are not safely able to cross the road. Some of you may remember that Goldsworth adopted an informal one way system on Bridge Barn Lane where traffic is only travelling one way therefore making it safer for our families. We would like to relaunch this to try and ensure this is a far less stressful experience for all members of our community. Please see below for further details. This informal one way system has also been shared with staff as some of them may be leaving the school at drop off and they will also be turning left to support our children's safety.

Scarlet Fever Guidance

To keep you updated, we now have cases of Scarlet Fever and Strep Throat across the school and many children with the common symptoms.

If your child has a temperature or is unwell please keep them at home and let the office know. The symptoms we are seeing are temperature and a sore throat. Please do keep an eye on your children and if your child has been unwell for a few days with symptoms I would advise seeking medical advice from 111 or your GP. If your child is diagnosed with Strep Throat or Scarlet Fever please do let us know. If you or your child has Scarlet Fever, stay away from school for 24 hours after you take the 1st dose of antibiotics.

The NHS has guidance on symptoms of scarlet fever and this is a link to the UK Health Security Association frequently answered questions.

As a Trust we have ensured that our infection control policy and procedures are adhered to and we will continue to put in place preventive measures to reduce transmission. We have shared this policy and procedures with all staff to ensure the safety of our school community.

As ever we really appreciate your support and vigilance with this matter as we all try to stay well for the festive season.

Informal one way traffic system

Informal one way system

- Between the hours of 8:30-9:10
- Between the hours of 3:00-3:45
- Please leave school and turn left onto Bridge Barn Lane
- Turn right onto Mabel Street
- Turn right onto Wilfred Street
- At the end you can then turn left or right onto Goldsworth Road

This will allow the traffic, at peak times, to flow outside of school, making it safer for the children and members of our community.

In the same way, if you are parked in Bridge Barn car park please:

- Turn right on to Bridge Barn Lane
- Turn left into Mabel Street
- Turn right onto Wilfred Street
- At the end you can then turn left or right onto Goldsworth Road

Curriculum Swimming

Payments towards curriculum swimming lessons can now be made on ParentMail. Reception children will receive 8 lessons during the course of the year whilst the rest of the school will receive 12 lessons.

The Curriculum swimming lessons are a great way of introducing children to swimming (and hopefully starting a lifelong love of swimming) as well as allowing more experienced swimmers to hone their technique. However, we would encourage all children to have additional lessons beyond those provided during the school day. As well as Woking's lessons at Pool in the Park, there are a number of private swim schools in the area and we also run after school lessons during term time.

Spring term clubs

Please find attached the club's list for the spring term. Having listened to feedback from the last sign up we have reviewed our process. Children will still be able to attend one free after-school club for the half term, however the initial sign-up is now an expression of interest and not run on a first come, first served basis. This will be open on ParentMail from **9am Tuesday 13th December to 9pm Sunday 18th December**.

Once this has closed, clubs will be assigned to children based on, but not limited to previous waiting lists, previous terms sign ups and attendances, number of places available and invitations to attend from the lead teacher.
