


Korea, Japan, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines and Singapore.

Sports Update

January may have tried its best to dampen the spirts of the Goldsworth students with the wet weather, and freezing temperatures, but they have shown fantastic resilience to remain focused, in PE, afterschool clubs and fixtures over the course of the term so far.

First up, against the conditions, the Year 5 and 6 girls partook in a tournament at Greenfield School. With so many training regularly with Mr Funnell each week it was pleasing to give 8 students the chance to make their footballing debuts. The girls played with fantastic commitment against a number of strong teams with Sophie really using her head to pull off some brilliant saves in goal, keeping Goldsworth in sight. The girls got stronger with each match and were unlucky not to get their first win of the day against Knaphill, and narrowly lost to semifinalists St Hugh of Lincoln in the last game thanks to the storming runs from Izzy, Evie C, and Michaela and excellent defending from Holly, Lexi, Zoha and Mia. Supported by the non-stop running of Amy and Eva. A great day of sweat, mud and smiles from all involved.



Next up, the U11 Girls travelled to Dorking Wanders FC to compete in the 2nd round of the ESFA national cup. Whilst the goals were supplied by Georgia, Eva, Evie T and Phi's smooth passing, committed defending and excellent teamwork from Erin, Maria, Grace, Rayaan and Kimberly helped create numerous chances. Undefeated, the girls took the title of Surrey champions and now move on to the next round in London later this term.
