#### **Head's Lines**

Dear Parents/Carers,

Wellbeing and Mental Health is always a priority – however during these unpredictable times, having a focus upon wellbeing and health is essential. The general uncertainties of life at present will not only be having an impact on the wellbeing of the adults in our school community, but also likely to be having an impact on children's wellbeing. Next week is the national 'Children's Mental Health Week' which runs from 6th February to 12th February 2023. The theme this year is 'Let's Connect'.

'Let's Connect' is about making connections with others in healthy, rewarding and meaningful ways. This can be online, in a team or choir or shared dance, in the community, through acts of kindness, etc. Let's Connect is about making meaningful connections. Human beings thrive in communities, and this connection is vital for our wellbeing. When we have healthy connections – to family, friends and others – this can support our mental health and our sense of wellbeing. And when our need for rewarding social connections is not met, we can sometimes feel isolated and lonely – which can have a negative impact on our mental health. The children will be having an assembly on Monday and will be having time to reflect on this theme throughout the week.

We have been fortunate to have a number of parent workshops for parents and carers to share more about how we teach in Reception, phonics and, more recently, maths in KS1. The adults were able to see what strategies and key vocabulary we use in school, enabling them to support their child/ren at home. Each of these workshops has been a success and we have received positive feedback and some ideas of future workshop themes. Please remember to complete the feedback for these workshops so we can continue to share what we do here to ensure that the learning experiences for our children, both at school and home, are the best they can be.

### **Attendance Matters!**



Reminder: Just to remind parents/carers that if you take your children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), you will be liable to receive a penalty notice issued from Surrey County Council. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

Please remember that every day at school matters for your child. At Goldsworth Primary we have a target to achieve an attendance level of 97% this academic year – let's work together to reach this!

### **Sports Update**

Another eventful week has passed by for the Goldsworth students and it gives me chance to praise their achievements yet again. Firstly, last Friday Mrs Cockin took a well prepared team of year 5 & 6 of athletes to take part in the 1st round of the National Indoor Athletics at the Guilford Spectrum. Competing in a range of running, jumping and throwing event the team performed fantastically to finish 1st overall and move on to the 2nd round for the County title.

The U11 Girls and Year 5 boys were next up playing their first league matches against Sythwood as well as a friendly against Brookwood School. The girls took an early lead



against Brookwood through goals from Georgia and Eva, and were able to maintain the pressure throughout the first half with Florence in particular unlucky not to score on debut this season. With a large squad, we were able to rotate and give game time to 12 students. Who were all involved in helping Goldsworth to a 5-0 win. Next up, was a much sterner test against a very committed Sythwood team, and despite keeping possession for large parts the game. Sythwood defended resolutely and challenged on the counter attack. With the game still 0-0 going into the last minute, Eva was able to break the deadlock and secure the win.

For the Year 5 boys it was a chance for many of them to play their first match for the school and were a mix of nerves and excitement going into it under the watchful eye of Mrs Henderson. A slow start against Brookwood, saw them concede an early goal, however undeterred the boys grew in confidence as the match went on. Noah, Ethan and Rory were running nonstop, and ably supported by Eesa, and Haroon, before Luke managed to grab an equaliser, and were unlucky not to get a winner with the Brookwood goalkeeper pulling off two great saves from Jacob.

The Sythwood game was another stern test for the team, but Peter and Azaan working in Goal and defence well prevented the opposition from scoring. A 0-0 draw looked to be on the cards before Goldsworth rallied and Luke was able to set up Rory for another late match winner. A fantastic effort from all of the students involved.
