Dear Parents/Carers,

Whilst it has been a shorter half term, we have still managed to pack it full of learning! This week has been no exception with the Reception Trip to Godstone Farm and 3MF assembly.

When preparing for life, we endeavor to build resilience and encourage independence and responsibility all throughout the school. We have noticed that there has been an increasing amount of parents/carers who are dropping items off throughout the day. Whilst we appreciate this cannot always be helped, we do not have the capacity in the office to ensure these many items get to the children throughout the day. 
World Book Day
