Head's Lines

Dear Parents/Carers,

1% BETTER EVERY DAY Each and every day, our children continue to develop themselves, both as learners and as human beings. We are inspired by our children on a daily basis in their hope, courage, and determination and strive to reach their full potential.

The children demonstrated their thoughts for others in our assembly this week when we learnt about the declining numbers of hazel dormice from 3.5.million to only 750.000 in 30 years. We learnt that we can help by protecting their habitat and talked about local areas where we might find this vulnerable creature locally. We talked about things we could do in own spaces: build a bug hotel, put out bird feeders, leave a wild patch to support all kinds of wildlife. This demonstrated their thoughts for others and their understanding of the local area and wider world around them.

Our aim at Goldsworth is for our pupils and staff to be the 'Best they can be', we strive for bright futures for children and staff alike. For every individual to know that they are safe, loved, respected and valued for their uniqueness and individuality. We are always striving to develop our teaching and learning further, to keep up to date with the latest research and best practice, to ensure that our children have happy and fun playtimes, to be inclusive and celebrate diversity and to offer the best chances and opportunities for our children and staff.

To support this we have collected parent views via our recent survey. Thank you to the parents/carers who completed this, there are more details below. We are about to conduct a pupil survey which can support this aim even further and help us gather pupil views across the school. **Pupil voice** (where all children have the opportunity to give their ideas and comments) is important to us and we have a number of avenues for the children to share their views. **Circle time**: where the class have conversations about current news and events, in school, locally, or further afield. **Time to talk boxes:** where children can express their success (both inside and outside school), their views and ideas and any worries or concerns they may have. **School Parliament**: a democratically selected leaders in year 6 and **School Council**: a democratically selected group of young leaders who work with Mrs. Cox on continuous school growth. **Year 6 leaders**: this is a group of young leaders who support others through their many roles of responsibility. **Pupil survey**: an opportunity for pupils from year 2-6 to complete a survey and pupils in Reception and year 1 to complete the same survey as a class.

All staff, continually, strive to recognise children who demonstrate our values. We are actively looking for our next pupils to receive the prestigious Golden Owl badge. The Golden Owls are given out three times a year to children who consistently go above and beyond throughout their day. We recognise that many children could be presented with this so we have other ways to reward pupils: House points, marbles in the jar for a team/class reward. Children can also receive a Headteacher sticker for effort and achievement. Also children can be given a golden ticket when they have shown good manners in the lunch hall and then get an opportunity to sit on a golden table with the Headteacher. My favourite part of my week!

Some of the main themes for improvement were:

- Continue to improve communication.
- Increase capacity at Wise Owls
- Continue to increase the after school clubs and enrichment opportunities.
- Continue to support our SEND pupils

We are delighted to see improvements and the clarification of our next steps.

In light of the survey feedback, we are also considering the following:

- Parent working groups to collate ideas and collaborate together.
- How we communicate our expectations for the children and how the children can continue to raise their achievement.
- Continued working with our parent forum.
- Teacher research group with colleagues from the Trust looking at the most recent suggestions for supporting with behaviour.
- How we can support families who need to raise a concern and/or contact the school, in particular who and how to contact being made clearer.

End of day collection-Safeguarding

With the support of our governors, we have been reviewing our end of day arrangements and are wanting to make changes to these to ensure increased safety for our children.

From **Monday 13th March**, all children from Reception up to Year 4, will be picked up, by an adult from their classroom. Teachers will be on the door dismissing their class safely and any children who have not been picked up by 3.30pm will be taken to the office. Please note, teachers have further commitments after the school day, so are not always available after this time.

Children in Year 5 and 6 will either walk home if they have permission, or wait on the grass area, by the carpark, for a parent. There will continue to be a staff presence on the gate.

If another parent is picking up your child, please inform us as normal.

Although we are aware that this may be a change for some families, this has been something we have considered for a while and more recently, feedback from our community has confirmed our need for action, to ensure the safety of all our children.

Thank you for your support in keeping our children safe.
