Sports update

We have a lot to catch up on in terms of sports at Goldworth in recent weeks and it has been a pleasure to witness the students challenge themselves in a range of competitions. First up we saw the U11 Cross Country compete in the first round of the Woking Cross Country competition at Hoebridge School, where nearly 100 students taking part in each race there was a lot of stiff competition. The boys team showed excellent commitment with Miloh placing 1st, Oscar T 16th, Luke 20th, Harry 25th, and Oscar H 44th. The girls were equally as impressive with Florence 7th, Evie T 9th, Amy 16th, Eva 29th and Poppy 56th. A fantastic set of results with the U9 competition taking place next week in the second round. Thank you also to Mrs Cox for managing the team on the day.

We then followed this up with the Surrey round of the Indoor Athletics competition at The Spectrum in Guilford. Showcasing their talents in Running, Jumping and Throwing events. Having had a number of training sessions with Mrs Cockin and Mr Worth refining their techniques Goldsworth battled against the other regional winners to take 6^{th} place in the county.

Next up the U10s and the U9s Football teams travelled to New Haw where we now hear from our sports correspondence Luke and Zac with the match reports.

U9 Match Report – by Zac

On Monday 13th March a team of fearless boys from Year 3 and 4 faced New Haw Primary School. New Haw started strong and tested out Zac and Abdul who were defending solidly. Our amazing goalkeeper Finlay made some incredible saves, while the speedy Matthew and skilful Laurie attacked. But unfortunately for us, New Haw scored a really lucky goal! The ball was flying over the crossbar, until the wind caught it and made it drop down under the crossbar! 1:0 to New Haw. Despite the skill and enthusiasm of the Goldsworth boys, the game ended sadly as New Haw scored a second goal just before the final whistle. The game ended 2:1 to New Haw.

After a tough opening game against West Byfleet losing 4-1 the girls rallied in their second match and narrowly missed out on a win against St Mary's after goals from Tayliah and Eva with the score finishing 2-2. With confidence growing, the girls played St Dunstan's in another close game losing narrowly 3-1 before finishing the day against Pyrford. The speed and fluency of passing increase and Goldsworth made numerous scoring chances with Dhruhi scoring 3 seconds half goals to win 5-2.
