

Report from Mr. Funnell, Goldsworth Girls Football Coach: U11 Girls Football

On Wednesday this week the year 6 Girls football team travelled to Thames Mead in Kent for the 3rd round of the English Schools FA Cup South East finals. Expectations were high as the now Surrey Champions looked to take on the best of the 12 counties that make up the greater South East of England. Kent Champions Days Lane were a formidable 1st opponent for the girls, they fought hard throughout the match but were undone by an incredible strike from one of the players of the tournament ending the match 1-0 to Kent. The incredibly talented Norfolk champions Woodlands were next, again the girls battled hard throughout, with Grace, Maria, Erin and Sophie keeping some outstanding players out of the game and our goal safe while our attack pressed for a much needed goal. Chances for Eva, Georgia, Rayan and Kimberly were just kept out by some outstanding defence and left the game 0-0 at the final whistle with a vital point for Goldsworth going into our last match. Bedfordshire champions Scott Primary were our last opponent in the group stage and a must win game for Goldsworth, all-out attack was the order of the day and the girls delivered with wave after wave of efforts led by our 2 incredible strikers Evie T and Phi forcing Scott Primary to defend with all players.
