

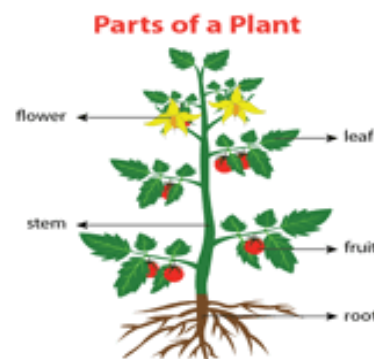


# Plants

## Big picture

Do you know where plants come from? Do you know how plants grow successfully? Through a variety of practical experiences, we will learn more of the wonder of the natural world.



## As Readers

We will continue to work on retrieval and inference skills, particularly focusing on finding evidence in a text.

These texts will be used as part of our Literacy lessons.

We will also explore a range of non-fiction texts linked to plants.

## As Writers

We will identify the features of a non-fiction brochure and create our own brochure based on our Tin Forest text.

We will continue to develop narrative writing using a short film to inspire a story. We will use varied sentences starters, include exciting adjectives and correct use of speech punctuation.

## As Mathematicians

We will look at a range of fractions in shapes and number; find fractions of amounts and add and subtract fractions.

We will look at length: converting between units and carry out practical activities. We will measure and calculate perimeters.

## As Artists

We will discover the work of William Morris and explore repeated patterns.

We will make our own printing block and make repeated patterns using paint.

## As Scientists

We will ask questions and carry out investigations to find out what plants need to grow well.

We will carry out investigations to identify different parts of a plant and the job each part does. We will discover how pollination occurs.

As **Geographers** we will be looking at how we can improve Woking by exploring both the physical and human features.
