

Reminder informal one way traffic system

For the safety of our children and community please remember to use the informal one way system:

- Between the hours of 8:30-9:10
- Between the hours of 3:00- 3:45
- Please leave school and turn left onto Bridge Barn Lane
- Turn right onto Mabel Street
- Turn right onto Wilfred Street
- At the end you can then turn left or right onto Goldsworth Road

This will allow the traffic, at peak times, to flow outside of school, making it safer for the children and members of our community.

In the same way, if you are parked in Bridge Barn car park please:

- Turn right on to Bridge Barn Lane
- Turn left into Mabel Street
- Turn right onto Wilfred Street
- At the end you can then turn left or right onto Goldsworth Road

It's been a busy start to the summer term for the Goldsworth students who have once again have carried themselves in a wonderfully positive manner in all events they have been involved in.

Football Friendlies

The first week back saw the Year 6 Boys and Girls take on Beaufort Primary School in a friendly for the girls and a league match for the boys. With the weather on our side for once two fantastic games were played out as the Girls won 4-1 with goals from Georgia x 2, Maria and Evie C. The boys played with passion, skill and determination but were held to a 1-1 draw with the goal coming from Luke, to round off a season which saw them only lose one game in normal time in all competitions.

Girls Largest Football Session

Having been snowed off before Easter we were able to finally host our session, aimed at increasing the participation levels of girls' football within the school in line with the targets of the FA nationally. Over 100 students took part from all year groups and it was great to see a number of our students from year 6 help coach students from Reception, Year 2, 3 and 4 throughout the day also. Following on from this a number of girls from Year 2 were also able to attend a Football festival ran by Woking Leisure Centre where the girls had access to coaching, followed by some friendly small sided games.

Football Finals

Year 5 Boys - Miss Baird

On Friday 28th April, as winners of their league, our Year 5 Boys' Football team were invited to the finals, which was hosted at Pirbright. Our team was made up of Ethan, Seth, Luke, Naya, Rory, Noah S, Reggie, William and Shaine and they all played brilliantly - it was a real pleasure to take them to the tournament!

Our first match was against Pirbright where in the first half, Luke scored 2 and then in the second half, we had more goals from William, Naya and Rory. Our second game saw us take on New Haw, who got an early lead in the first half and secured their win with a second goal later in the game. I was so impressed with our boys as they defended brilliantly and kept pushing right to the final whistle - we just couldn't seem to get the ball in the back of the net. We had it all to play for in the final game against Hermitage. After going 1 down in the first half, William scored a great goal and shortly followed it up with another! Naya went on to score a fantastic goal and William secured us a 4 2 victory with his hat trick. After our win, we turned to the final game that was playing as the result of this would determine whether we had first or second place overall. In the final seconds of the game, New Haw scored which took them above us in points.

Our boys left the tournament with an overall second and I could not be prouder of them. They played to the best of their ability for every minute of every game and worked together the whole way through. Well done to you all!

Year 6 Girls Football Final – From Mr Funnel

Against the current ever-present threat of protesters disrupting major sporting events the year 6 girls took on the top 3 sides in the Woking area in the league finals tournament, such was the magnitude of the occasion Miss Baird also joined us to co-coach the team. The setting, a beautiful spring evening at Pirbright village school on one of the only dry days in April, Mr Worth ordered a large helping of Champagne football and that is exactly what the girls delivered.

1st up arch rivals St Dunstan's, the girls set up in an attacking formation to overwhelm the St Dunstan's defence with wave after wave of attacks from all possible angles, shots rained in on the St Dunstan's goal from every Goldsworth player on the pitch but with some bad luck and a lot of woodwork somehow the ball kept out of the net. In the dying seconds of the match with everyone expecting a draw St Dunstan's with a rare shot stole the win and the points. Next up a strong St Mary's team, again the girls attacked from the start this time with an early goal settling the nerves, a quick goal from St Mary's after half time kept the game finely balanced before a charge down the pitch from Georgia, weaving in and out of the St Mary's defence for fun and then calmly powering the ball home left the game 2-1 to Goldsworth and a crucial win in the tournament. The Girls final game, and somewhat of a local Derby, saw us take on Knaphill. A rousing team talk before the must win game fired up the girls and with the lasting words of 'let's win it for Miss Baird' ringing in their ears the girls kicked off and raced to a quick 3-0 lead. Again, the attacking nature of the girls' play was too much for an impressive Knaphill team and this time the goals came flooding in with further unanswered goals in the second half ending the match 6-0 to the green and gold.

St Dunstan's took the league finals title on the day with a clean sweep of wins and Goldsworth in second rounding off a remarkable season from the girls.
