Pick up arrangements

To ensure we are safeguarding our pupils, we will only allow siblings aged 14 or over, to collect a child from school. We will require a form to be filled out to confirm this, as shown below. This form can be picked up from the school office. We have taken guidance from the DfE and from the NSPCC when making these decisions.

Parents and carers are expected to arrive at school by 3:20pm to collect their child/ren - the school gates open at 3:15pm. It is important that parents and carers are punctual for this as it can affect a child's wellbeing if a parent/carer is not there at the end of the day. Teaching staff often have clubs or meetings after the school day, so they are not able to keep a child beyond this time.

If a child hasn't been collected, the teacher will take the child to the office to be collected from there. The school will keep a record of times when a parent/carer is late to pick up their child/ren and the headteacher or senior leader may request a meeting with the parent/carer to discuss the issue, if this becomes a regular occurrence. If a child is not picked up by 3:45pm, due to the school office closing at 4pm, they will be taken to Wise Owl after school provision and a charge will be made for this.

I wish to inform you that my child will be collected by their older sibling. I can confirm that their older sibling is at least 14 years of age and I as the parent accept full responsibility for their welfare walking home from school.

Sports update

As another busy half term of sport comes to an end, it is a chance to keep you updated on the sporting achievements of the Goldsworth students as they have, as always performed with commitment, endeavour and sportsmanship.

Football

Last week saw the U10 Boys and Girls compete in the Woking 6 a side competition at Woking Leisure Centre. The boys took on St Mary's in the first game 2-1 with Reggie finishing off a sweeping attack to seal the win. Next up they took on a talented Sythwood, who pushed them for large parts of the game, however composed play from Seth and Ethan in defence allowed Rory and Noah to torment the opposition and allow Matthew to score 2 goals in a 4-0 win. The last group game against Kingfield saw the boys go behind to an early goal, but the boys showed great teamwork and composure through Shaine, Luke and William to keep the pressure on the Kingfield defence and to score 4 goals, whilst



Finlay pulled off some dramatic saves to prevent Kingfield scoring again.

A semi-final against Hermitage beckoned, who stunned Goldsworth with 3 early goals. The boys worked tirelessly to get back into the game scoring late on, but were eventually beaten 4-1 by the tournament winners.

The afternoon saw the girls have their opportunity to play, after having been training with Mr Funnel over the course of the year many girls were making their debuts. The first game was a back and forth contest against St John's as Ava scored early on, followed by another from Carys but the girls were undone by a later winner from a tireless St John's team. In their next games against Knaphill and St Hughes, Goldsworth continued to show lots of positives, moving the ball into space and putting pressure on the opposition goal, but were unable to convert their chances losing 4-1 and 5-1 respectively. Undeterred these results, the girls played against Pirbright, and during this game



things seemed to click. As Sydney made a number of excellent saves, Termeh and Amy were menaces in defense, Goldsworth got the breakthrough they were after and raced into a 3-0 lead before Pirbright scored one late on. To cap the day off a rematch against St Johns saw Goldsworth continue to grow in confidence with Charlotte, Leila and Izzy creating opportunities for Holly to score a hattrick and Lexi also to find the back of the net. A fantastic way to finish off the day.

Cricket

The weather has been more favourable in recent weeks and with this, the chance for our year 5 boys, year 6 boys and U11 girls teams have been able to take part in the WASPs tournaments at Old Woking CC.

The year 5 boys team, under the watchful eyes of Mrs Mills finished second in their group, to reach the semi-finals, where they were able to see off Sythwood, thanks to a committed fielding and bowling display from the whole team. The final was a tense affair as Goldsworth tried to build a score against a very talented Horsell team but were unable to get the wickets needed to win the game.

Next up, the year 6s started off going down against a well organised West Byfleet team who were able to restrict the number of runs Goldsworth were able to score taking a number of wickets early on. This did not deter the boys though who battled on against St Mary's and New Haw getting better with every game finishing off with the victory they had been chasing against St Johns.

The final tournament was the U11 Girls, with many of the girls playing their first cricket matches. The opening fixture against West Byfleet was closely contested as Fatima, and Eva got late wickets to put pressure on the opposition, but were pipped to victory in the last over. Next up was a St John's team, filled with big hitters Jess, Avantika and Aadya were able to bowl with accuracy to keep the score low. Goldsworth chased well, but were left needing a lot of runs in the last 2 overs. With free reign to 'go for it' Eva and Mia combined to score 38 off of the last 10 balls to get the first win of the day. The final group game was another close game, Keerthana and Avantika kept the scoreboard ticking over with runs and Evie helped herself to two wickets to put us into the final.

A rematch against an undefeated West Byfleet was a great opportunity to see how much the girls had improved over the course of the afternoon. Every batting pair worked wonderfully together, scoring runs, preventing the opposition from getting much needed wickets. With a reasonable target set it is in the field where the girls really shone. Working together to prevent 4s and 6s being scored and taking 4 wickets over the course of the innings. Goldsworth won by 16 runs to win the tournament and will go on to play in the County Final after half term.
