Tickets are £6 for adults and £4 for children (under 3s free), and can be purchased <u>here</u>. Please note that there will be no ticket sales on the gate. This is a sell-out event every year, so buy early to avoid disappointment! Please tell your friends, family and neighbours about this event, it is open to everyone.

WE NEED YOUR HELP!

We really can't run major events like this without your support. If you can spare some time, please sign up for a 30 minute or hour slot manning one of our stalls or collecting entry tickets by clicking <u>here</u>, or let your class rep know you can help. Rope in the kids, grandparents, other school parents – it's more fun with a friend! And don't worry, you won't miss the firework display!

What do we need help with?

- Running the bar, food, hot chocolate and glow toys stalls

- Keeping our audience safe during the fireworks

- Setting up before the event

- Clearing up - help with clear up is hugely appreciated (especially by those who will be there all day!)

Important things to note:

1. Children must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times.

- 2. Fireworks are weather dependent, if it is deemed unsafe to do the fireworks display, we will postpone until a future date.
 - 3. Tickets are non-refundable, if the event is postponed your tickets will be transferred to the new date.
 - 4. We cannot guarantee the start time of the fireworks display, the display is usually towards the end of the festival but if weather conditions change, we will start the display earlier.
 - 5. For safety reasons the entrance gate will be closed 15 minutes before the firework display.
- 6. A quiet room will be available to watch the display, this will be one of the year 2 classrooms, please ask a volunteer for more information on the day.



School Meals

Pick up Arrangements

To ensure we are safeguarding our pupils, we will only allow siblings aged 14 or over, to collect a child from school. We will require a form to be filled out to confirm this, as shown below. This form can be picked up from the school office. We have taken guidance from the DfE and from the NSPCC when making these decisions.

Parents and carers are expected to arrive at school by 3:20pm to collect their child/ren - the school gates open at 3:15pm. It is important that parents and carers are punctual for this as it can affect a child's wellbeing if a parent/carer is not there at the end of the day. Teaching staff often have clubs or meetings after the school day, so they are not able to keep a child beyond this time.

If a child hasn't been collected, the teacher will take the child to the office to be collected from there. The school will keep a record of times when a parent/carer is late to pick up their child/ren and the headteacher or senior leader may request a meeting with the parent/carer to discuss the issue, if this becomes a regular occurrence. If a child is not picked up by 3:45pm, due to the school office closing at 4pm, they will be taken to Wise Owl after school provision and a charge will be made for this.

I wish to inform you that my child will be collected by their older sibling. I can confirm that their older sibling is at least 14 years of age and I as the parent accept full responsibility for their welfare walking home from school.
