#### Head's Lines

Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope you have all had a great week.

I wanted to let you know a bit more about the reasons for us introducing 'Fabulous Walking' to the school. The idea comes from a book called 'When the Adults Change, Everything Changes' by Paul Dix. The book is all about how we create the best climate and culture for exceptional behaviour to develop and fabulous walking is just one of the ideas that is described. Paul Dix repeatedly discusses the need for visible consistency in a school and describes a headteacher who had introduced fabulous walking 'with love, humour and a sense of pride in 'our school'......In this school the visible consistency made everyone feel safe. It is done with kindness and consent.' I think that all the staff would tell you that asking children to 'walk fabulously' is so much more preferable than calling down the corridor to 'stop running', or even 'walk!'. It is kind, it is fun and it is helping everyone to be consistently safe and calm. Paul Dix finishes this chapter by saying, 'Visible consistency with visible kindness allows exceptional behaviour to flourish.'

In other news, Year three have thoroughly enjoyed their Viking workshop today where they have been studying Viking artefacts and learning to play some Viking games which has really brought their learning to life. I have also had the pleasure of reading some of their writing linked to this unit which is full of exciting adjectives and description. Well done Year 3!

### **School Meals**

ParentMail should be back up and running for ordering Schools Meals as of Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September. If you have not been able to place your order via ParentMail for Monday 25<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> September please email <u>lunches@goldsworthprimary.co.uk</u> with your meal options.

## Pick up Arrangements

To ensure we are safeguarding our pupils, we will only allow siblings aged 14 or over, to collect a child from school. We will require a form to be filled out to confirm this, as shown below. This form can be picked up from the school office. We have taken guidance from the DfE and from the NSPCC when making these decisions.

Parents and carers are expected to arrive at school by 3:20pm to collect their child/ren - the school gates open at 3:15pm. It is important that parents and carers are punctual for this as it can affect a child's wellbeing if a parent/carer is not there at the end of the day. Teaching staff often have clubs or meetings after the school day, so they are not able to keep a child beyond this time.

If a child hasn't been collected, the teacher will take the child to the office to be collected from there. The school will keep a record of times when a parent/carer is late to pick up their child/ren and the headteacher or senior leader may request a meeting with the parent/carer to discuss the issue, if this becomes a regular occurrence. If a child is not picked up by 3:45pm, due to the school office closing at 4pm, they will be taken to Wise Owl after school provision and a charge will be made for this.

I wish to inform you that my child will be collected by their older sibling. I can confirm that their older sibling is at least 14 years of age and I as the parent accept full responsibility for their welfare walking home from school.
