Year Six Spring Term 2023—theme 1

As Writers and Readers we are starting by completing some research on different countries around the world to make a double page spread. This chronological report will help us build on our non-fiction writing and build our knowledge of the world around us. We will be reading The King that Banned the Dark and write a story based on what we would ban if we were leaders.

As Geographers we will be learning about geographical features of fair trade counties and comparing this to the UK. We will learn about their natural resources and products that are imported and exported. Children will learn how to give six figure grid references and give directions using eight compass points.

As Artists we will be drawing accurate depictions of famous UK landmarks such as the houses of parliament. To make our work more accurate we will be working on our understanding of perspective, proportions and shading.

As Musicians we'll be continuing to learn to compose and perform music as well as applying our growing bank of musical vocabulary to varying musical forms. In line with our Going Global topic, we will also be taking part in an exciting music workshop and learning about music and culture from around the world.

As Scientists, we will be learning how things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics. Looking at similarities and differences including micro-organisms, plants and animals through the use of classification keys.

In PSHE we are learning all about first aid. We are going to learn to notice the signs of choking, what to do if we see them and basic life support.

In RE we are focusing on Christianity: 'What do Christians believe about the Messiah—and why is it good news?'
