

Penalty Notice Reminder

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court.

Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

School Lunches...



School Lunches

School lunches are currently available to order for after half term until the end of this academic year. Please place your orders through the Arbor app or website, remembering there is a 5 day cut off to allow the kitchen to order the food in. If there are any days for which you have missed the deadline you will need to provide a packed lunch from home for your child on those days.

Whilst you are in Arbor, please top up your meals account balance if it is running low, particularly if your child is in Year 6 as any outstanding balance will need to be cleared before the end of the academic year. Thank you.

Please note that we have received notification from Twelve15 that with effect from September 2024 the price for a school lunch will rise to £2.80 per meal. If you believe you may be eligible for Free School Meals please ask at the School Office for a form and this can be checked for you.

If your child would prefer to bring a packed lunch from home on any day that you have ordered a school lunch for please do let us know by email to lunches@goldsworthprimary.co.uk so that we can cancel the school lunch with the kitchen.


Cross Country Tuesday 21st May...






Congratulations to Scarlett in year 6 who is playing the role of Alice Creel in Stranger Things The First Shadow at the Phoenix Theatre in London's West End.


