

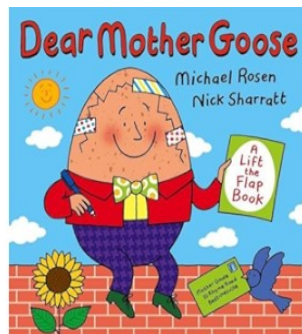


# Learning to Learn: Dear Mother Goose
