As Readers, we will continue with 'Letters from the Lighthouse' and develop our prediction and inference skills through class discussion. When we answer questions in our books, we learn to find evidence in the text to strengthen our point of view.

As Mathematicians, we will build on our understanding of parts and wholes by beginning to calculate percentages. Our understanding of measure will be developed by converting between different units of measure and we will learn more about statistics: how we can represent them and gather information from them.

As Scientists, we will develop our understanding of animals and humans by learning about the circulatory and respiratory systems. We will carry out investigations to see how exercise effects our breathing rate and heart rate, as well as learning what our blood is made of.

As Geographers, we will consider where our energy comes from. We will learn about different sources of energy and their trading routes, including renewable and non-renewable energy, and consider the benefits and drawbacks of each. We will examine maps to identify human features and use our historical knowledge to consider how transport links have changed over time.

As Designers, we will design and build a steady hand game, like 'Operation', using our scientific understanding of electrical circuits. We will consider both form and function in our designs as well as think about what makes an effective design.

As Musicians, we'll be continuing to learn to compose and perform music as well as applying our growing bank of musical vocabulary to varying musical forms. In line with our Going Global topic, we will also be taking part in an exciting music workshop and learning about music and culture from around the world.

In RE we will learn about the Holy Trinity, a central part of Christian belief, and think about how three can also be one.
