We will learn about the structure of stories. We will also explore rhythm and rhyme in poetry. We will continue to build our reading skills through daily Phonics.

As **Writers**, we will create our own character and villain to change a story. We will be authors as we write our own story with a problem. We will also learn to describe a setting.

As **Mathematicians**, we will learn to subtract. We will then use our place value skills to understand numbers to 50. We will compare, measure and solve problems involving length and height.

As **Historians**, we will explore how explorers have changed the world.

As **Scientists**, we will learn about how to keep our bodies healthy. We will learn the food groups and explore the Eatwell plate.

In **DT**, we will design and make a fruit smoothie.

As **Artists**, we will be learning to collage. We will create seascape pictures using collage techniques.

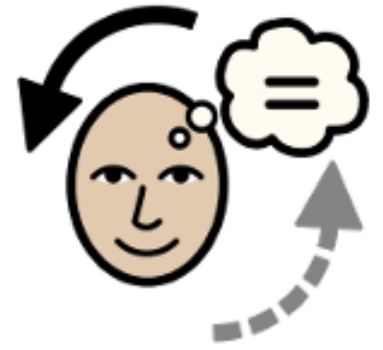
