Year Six Summer Term 2025

As Writers and Readers we will start our learning with the spooky tale of 'Alma', grow our vocabulary and think about how we change our language for different genres. In guided reading we will be continuing to read Wonder considering key themes and how the author addresses these.

As Mathematicians we will be focusing on our reasoning and problem solving skills so we can apply all of our mathematical knowledge in a range of contexts.

As Scientists, we will be continuing our Evolution and Inheritance topic considering how animals have adapted and evolved over time to survive in their environment.
