



Entry: The children will become explorers, searching the grounds of Goldsworth School to find the missing fairy doors. We will explore a range of fairy tales, leading up to the design and creation of our wonderful fairy tale props.

Throughout our topic we will have the opportunity to explore and develop moral concepts and values on dilemmas raised through the fairy tales. Using philosophical questions we will discuss the messages hidden within the stories. We will be exploring the whole school value of respect.

Thinking skills and personal capabilities

We will continue to develop our key skills of:

- resilience
- reflectiveness
- collaboration
- creative thinking
- independence

As **Writers**, we will retell and reinvent the classic fairy tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. We will also look at Emily Gravett's 'Wolves' book and create information pages about fairy tale creatures.

As **Readers,** we will enjoy reading a range of fairytales. We will build on our phonic knowledge and develop comprehension skills.

As **Mathematicians**, we will be learning to count to 100 through different steps including counting up and back in tens. The children will look at comparing numbers using their place value knowledge and we will revisit number bonds.

As **Scientists**, we will be comparing and describing different materials, looking at how materials change under different forces and using technical language associated with materials.

As **Artists**, we will look at the work of Georgia O'Keefe to explore tints and tones in our paintings. As **designers**, we will make our own house for the three little pigs.

In **Geography,** we will explore hot and cold places and compare the UK to Kenya.

In **Religious Education**, we will explore the question, 'What is God like for Christians?'

As **Musicians**, we will use the song Hands, Feet, Heart to celebrate and learn about South African Music.

In **PE**, we will practice games to build teamwork and develop ball skills.
