As **Readers:** We will be reading the story, *The Wild Way Home* by Sophie Kirtley. We will be developing our retrieval and inference skills and exploring new vocabulary.

As **Writers:** We begin the term consolidating our learning on the grammatical structure of sentences using the book 'Chocoplot' and our knowledge of the rainforest to inspire us with ideas. Using the book *The Wild Way home* as our inspiration, we will then be writing our own suspense stories.

As **Geographers:** We will be exploring where our food comes from and how our food choices impact our environment. To do this we will be calculating food miles as well as considering how fair trade helps to support producers in other countries. Closer to home, we will be looking at where the ingredients in our school dinners are sourced and interviewing a member of staff.

As **Mathematicians:** We will continue to use formal methods to multiply and divide before moving on to learning to calculate length and perimeter.

As **Scientists:** We will explore the importance of teeth and the digestive system in the human body. We will be looking at the different types and purposes of human teeth, the parts and functions of a tooth, we will investigate how healthy different drinks are on our teeth and the functions of our digestive organs.

As **Artists:** We will learning about the artist, Alberto Giacometti and through the inspiration of his work, we will be creating a silhouette sculpture using wire, tape and paint. Our sculptures will also be influenced by our bones and muscles science theme.
